When my brother would tell us he wanted to work in a foreign country one day my mom would silently pray that this


notion of him would pass. My father's thoughts also ran immediately to every possible danger he might face in an unfamiliar place. Their fear was that they wouldn't be there to help him or protect him. My mom wanted to argue him out of his plans, but she held her tongue. And in due time my brother did arrange to spend two years working in Japan and it was an amazing, life-giving adventure for him.

I wonder how often parents, being concerned for the safety and ease of their children's lives, subtly steer them away from exploring their true vocation. In essence, they are like Eli, who was charged with being Samuel's mentor. And yet when Samuel heard the voice of God calling in the night, Eli told him, "It's nothing. Go back to sleep."

It can be scary for parents when their children hear inner calls that take them to places they hadn't imagined for them, especially places away from them. But we needn't fear.

When Samuel finally listened and responded, the "Lord was with him," and every word of the Lord took its effect in Samuel's heart.
