Joseph was wise enough to be led by God as to where his family would live and how they would live.



Joseph had guts. And he had heart. And he had great love for Mary and Jesus. He showed great leadership in his family. Let's ask his help and guidance so that we might do the same.





St. Didacus Parish School will be on Christmas break from December 21, 2020 through January 1, 2021. School will resume on Monday, January 4th.








