On the feast of the Ascension we remember how Jesus was "taken up, after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles whom he had chosen" (Acts 1:2). Although the event of the ascension is depicted only in Luke and Acts, each Gospel in its own way describes the exaltation of the risen Jesus and what it meant for his disciples. In the words

of the psalm, "God mounts his throne amid shouts of joy; the LORD, amid trumpet blasts" (47:6).

Today's Gospel is Matthew's account of Jesus' triumph, which concludes with what is often called the Great Commission. Appearing to the eleven apostles on the mountain, the usual biblical site of divine revelation, Jesus reveals his new status and universal authority as risen Lord. "All power in heaven and on earth has been given to me," he declares. He will exercise this power on earth by sharing it with his disciples. So he authorizes them to make disciples of all nations. This is the vision of Ephesians, too. It says that the power God put to work in Christ, raising him from the dead and seating him at his right hand, "far above very principality, authority, power, and dominion" is now at work in the Church, which is his body.


