Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Last Sunday I read in all our Masses the letter of our Bishop to all the people of the Diocese of San Diego. Several drastic and difficult measures have been taken in order to prevent the spread of covid 19 especially to our most vulnerable members of our community. We have cancelled all the



Masses and other parish activities for an indefinite period. Contrary to what others have claimed, the bishops and the priests are not abandoning their people. We are and will always be in communion with our parishioners. We cannot fully understand the meaning or the reasons of all the things that are taking place in our life as a church and as a community. On my part, as your pastor, I continue to offer the daily and Sunday Masses on your behalf at our convent chapel. I continue to bring before the Lord all your prayers and intentions. The Lord will always be present among us in the Blessed Sacrament of the Church. We are having daily adoration and exposition of our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. The Church is open at designated times for you to come and visit the Lord and pray.

I am very grateful for your constant help and support of our Church especially in this difficult time. Like our Blessed Virgin Mary, she had her own problems, but these did not prevent her from going out to help others. The Lord has placed us in these trying moments to think and do more for others than for ourselves. Again, thank you and may the Lord keep you strong in your faith and healthy physically.

Bishop Robert McElroy released this statement to the priests regarding the coronavirus on March 13th:

In light of these government actions, and the public health challenge which underlies them, I consulted with the Presbyteral Council and as a result, I have concluded that the following

actions must be implemented in all of the parishes and schools of the Diocese of San Diego:

Effective Monday morning March 16th, no public daily or weekend Masses will be held. Parishes are encouraged to keep churches open for personal visitation, intermittent recitations of the Rosary, and Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament.

All Catholics in the Diocese of San Diego are dispensed from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass during the coming weeks.

All parish and diocesan schools and religious education programs will be suspended effective this Monday. The Diocesan School Office is notifying the schools of this suspension; the Office has in prior days sent to the schools substantive materials for long distance learning for use during the suspension.

We will be providing video streamed Sunday Masses celebrated by priests and bishops of our diocese in English, Spanish and Vietnamese every week. Give them the wisdom to invest in long-term solutions that will help prepare for or prevent future outbreaks. May they know your peace, as they work together to achieve it on earth. Whether we are home or abroad, surrounded by many people suffering from this illness or only a few. Jesus Christ, stay with us as we endure and mourn, persist and prepare. In place of our anxiety, give us your peace. Jesus Christ, heal us.

Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord Wednesday, March 25th



The feast of the Annunciation of the Lord celebrates Angel Gabriel's appearance to the Virgin Mary (Luke 1:26-38) and his announcement that she had been chosen to be the mother of the savior of the world. Also being celebrated during this feast is Mary's fiat, which means "let it be" in Latin-her willing acceptance of the news. We are reminded of the importance of this feast to our salvation

in various devotional prayers. Two examples that highlight the importance of this feast are the joyous mysteries of the Rosary and the Angelus. Mary, mother of our Lord, pray for us!

The fourth Sunday of Lent is rather unique; like the third Sunday of Advent ("Gaudete Sunday"), the fourth Sunday of Lent is a break in an otherwise penitential season. The vestments for this day will be rose, as they are on Gaudete



Sunday in Advent, and flowers may adorn the Altar. This day is called "Laetare Sunday" (also "Rose Sunday"), and takes its name from the opening words of the Mass, the Entrance Antiphon's "Laetare, Jerusalem" or "Rejoice, Jerusalem."



Servicio de Inmigración y Ciudadanía

El 13 de marzo, el Servicio de Inmigración y Ciudadanía de los Estados Unidos (USCIS) emitió una declaración aclarando que el USCIS no considerará el tratamiento o la atención preventiva para los inmigrantes legales relacionados con COVID-19 como parte de una determinación de inadmisibilidad de carga pública. En la declaración, el USCIS dice: Para abordar la posibilidad de que algunos extranjeros afectados por COVID-19 duden en buscar el tratamiento médico o los servicios preventivos necesarios, el US-CIS no considerará las pruebas, el tratamiento ni la atención preventiva (incluidas las vacunas, si hay una vacuna disponible) relacionada con COVID-19 como parte de una determinación de inadmisibilidad de cargo público, ni en relación con la condición de beneficio público aplicable a ciertos no inmigrantes que buscan una extensión de estadía o cambio de estado, incluso si dicho tratamiento es proporcionado o pagado por uno o más beneficios públicos, como se define en la regla (por ejemplo, Medicaid con fondos federales).

Tenga en cuenta que, como la regla de la carga pública está relacionada con los inmigrantes legales que buscan cambios de estado y / o visas, esto no es relevante para los inmigrantes indocumentados. Consulte la declaración completa de USCIS y no dude en comunicarse con CHA si tiene alguna pregunta sobre esta política.
