#### A MESSAGE FROM BISHOP MCELROY ABOUT THE PETER'S PENCE COLLECTION FOR NEXT WEEKEND

The Holy Father has established that, for the current year of 2020, the **Peter's Pence collection**, which traditionally takes place around the solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul on June 29th, will be taken throughout the world on the 27th Sunday of Ordinary time, the weekend of October 3-4, the memorial of St. Francis of Assisi.

The Peter's Pence collection is a gesture of solidarity through which we participate in the activity of the Pope as Pastor of the universal Church. It is an activity that also supports the most needy ecclesial communities in difficulty who approach the Apostolic See for help.

In an act of charity, parishioners continue an ancient practice, which began with the community of apostles. With this gift, we can broaden our gaze and our hearts to embrace the Church scattered throughout the world. The Church then becomes a companion for families and peoples on their journey toward human, spiritual and material development, for the benefit of all societies.

Peter's Pence represents a small offering, accompanied by grand desires and visions. It is an offering that each member of the faithful decides to give to the Pope so that he can provide for the needs of the whole Church, and wherever it finds itself most in need.

soccer in my freshman year and then basketball in the seminary—until the time I could hardly run up and down a field for hours dribbling the ball. But, I never thought of being a referee. I think it is a very interesting way to be in the game but not of it.

What I liked about the game of soccer and especially about "*reffing*"(being a referee) was that no arguing with the referee was tolerated. If you tried it, the ref would give you a "yellow card," holding it up to your face without speaking a word. It was your only warning. Do it again and he would "red card" you, kicking you out of the game if you were a player or off the field if you were the coach. It was the ref's way only. It taught players patience. It taught them to concentrate on the game and not blame those officiating for their problems. It taught us all to keep our mouths shut. Consequently, when you are a referee, you should take the responsibility to be fair and accurate seriously.

Scripture reminds us that God is just and forgiving. But our actions and our choices make a difference. We can argue all that we want and say what we think needs to be said as we compare ourselves with others. But it is to no avail. God judges us by God's standards and not by our perceptions.



This is a peaceful, legal event that is occurring at the same time in hundreds of cities throughout the world, including 50 locations in California this year. More than 17,200 babies have been saved and 107 abortion centers closed during 40 Days for Life since it started in 2007.

#### What prompts you to make the decisions you make? When confronted

with a decision, whether one that is more trivial and mundane or one that is more significant and profound, we rely on guidance. That guidance can be the result of im-

pulse and passion or the fruit of the interior voice of conscience. Decisions made on impulse and passion can be misguided and erroneous. Decisions based on conscience, or the moral voice within, will reflect the depth and maturity of our soul work. A more contemplative soul will make more contemplative decisions. A less developed conscience will make decisions based on the individual's level of development.

Conversion and a change of heart are at the core of Jesus' message precisely because of this reality. We are works in progress. For the person on fire with the Holy Spirit and centered on God, life reflects an ever-deepening awareness and heightened sense of God's presence and a greater willingness to do God's will. What is happening internally is validated by what is witnessed externally. The hypocrite is the one who says yes when they really mean no. From the start, they had no desire to do the virtuous act but wanted to outwardly appear as if they did.


Where are you on the road of integrity? Honesty is all that is required. God is good with that. It is okay to struggle with our decisions and wrestle with ourselves. Consciences on the path to maturity and greater depth are not always going to know what action is immediately best. We may, at first, say no to what we know is right and, after prayerful reflection and thought, come around to doing it. Conversion happens when our no changes to yes, regardless of how sinful or out of sync we may be at the time. God is anxious to welcome us to Himself. But we cannot embrace Him unless we want to. Learning to orient our gift of free will to what is of divine origin, right, and best is a discipline we must always tweak and perfect. ©LPi

"Those who concentrate on the life and doctrine of this child of Carmel who died at the age of twenty-four are seized with wonder and admiration. They



discover, in fact, that her contribution to spirituality is as original as it is profoundly traditional. They also discover that hidden under the Gospel-like simplicity of her message of 'the little way of childhood' is a spiritual structure both strong and perfectly balanced from the theological point of view. Her life of love of the absolute and of absolute love is of rare depth and fullness. It was a combination of certain interrelated spiritual principles and constitutes a true doctrine: this is 'the little way of childhood'. This doctrine is derived from a rediscovery of the central teaching of the Gospel, which may be expressed in this sentence: We are, in Christ, God's children, and we ought to love our Father in heaven with a filial love full of confidence and abandonment.


St. Thérèse had very great desires, yet she would never admit that she was a great soul or that she had the strength necessary to do great things, like the saints who had been proposed to her as models. So she had to find a way in keeping with this littleness of which she was so deeply conscious. More than this: she sought a way that depended on this very weakness. Had not the Apostle said: 'When I am weak then I am strong'...Confidence in God led St. Thérèse by paths of self-forgetfulness and poverty of spirit, to a wonderful simplification of the spiritual life. As she made spiritual childhood her own, so she made poverty of spirit her own. She aspired to be nothing more than 'a poor little child' who looks to her Father for everything and who obtains everything from Him because of this same poverty.

When we look at the life of St. Thérèse of the Child Jesus we are struck by its simplicity and wonderful transparency. We are amazed to discover through her not only the purest Gospel teaching but Christ Himself. We also notice that the unity of her spiritual life, and death are of a price, yield the same tone, and are proof of an equal plenitude. Like her Master, Thérèse is true, and also like Him, her person and her message are one."
