Today's Gospel occurs in the middle of Jesus' ministry. At first, Jesus' words seem to be about the value of self-sacrifice in a leader. "I am the Good Shepherd ... I will lay down my life for the sheep." The Apostles

likely would have accepted these words easily enough. But then comes something more strange. *"I lay down my life in order to take it up again ... I have power to lay it down and power to take it up again."* Only later, when Jesus opened the Scriptures to them after his resurrection, would the Apostles understand his words. Only then would they understand why such an act was necessary for the salvation of the world.

Even now, we may struggle with the necessity of Holy Week. How often do we hear complaints against the silence of God, as if He is the "hired man" who "runs away" from suffering? Jesus' life, death, and resurrection is our redemption in fact. God himself bears the full weight of sin's consequences. The Paschal Mystery is also a sign that happens in full view of the human experience. We have seen Jesus lay down his life. We have seen him accompany others. *"I know mine and mine know me."* We have seen him reach those outside the traditional flock, *"sheep not of this fold."* Jesus is the Good Shepherd, not only in Scripture but in our daily lives.

While we can't experience physically walking alongside him like the Apostles did, the grace of our redemption continues through the Church. We are shepherded by the sacraments, by faith formation, by good mentors. At the same time, we are not only the sheep. In imitating Jesus, we, too, are invited to lay down our lives for others. We can be the hands, feet, and shepherd's crook of Christ.

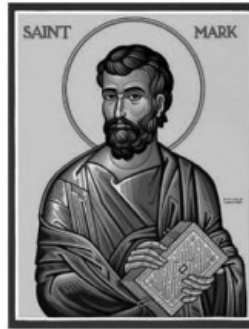

St. Mark, Evangelist Feast Day, Thursday, April 25th

Who was St. Mark? A disciple of Jesus and thus a witness to the story recounted in his Gospel? Perhaps the John Mark who appears in the book of Acts as a companion to Paul in his missionary journey? Regardless of his sources or his identity there is no doubt in writing

the first Gospel narrative, sometime around the year 70, Mark had a decisive influence on the subsequent shape of Christianity. Previously the teachings of Jesus circulated in the form of sayings; Paul's letters contain almost no reference to the actual life story of Jesus. But for Mark, the authority of Jesus' message was rooted in his paradoxical identity as the suffering and crucified Messiah. For Mark, this was best communicated in the form of a story.

His Gospel ends on a curiously dynamic and open-ended note. In place of an explicit account of the resurrection, he ends with the discovery of an empty tomb and the words of an angel: “Go tell his disciples and Peter that he is going before you to Galilee. There you will see him, as he told you.” Thus Mark addresses contemporary disciples. Jesus is no longer in the past or confined to Mark's story. He has gone ahead to Galilee. Mark's readers must write their own conclusion by taking up the cross of discipleship and going forth to meet him for themselves.

El evangelio de hoy ocurre en medio del ministerio de Jesús

Las palabras de Jesús parecen referirse al valor del sacrificio personal en un líder.

“Yo soy el Buen Pastor... doy mi vida por mis ovejas”. Los Apóstoles probablemente habrían aceptado estas palabras con bastante facilidad. Pero luego viene algo más extraño. “Doy mi vida para volver a tomarla... tengo poder para entregarla y poder para volverla a tomar”. Sólo más tarde, cuando Jesús después de su resurrección, los Apóstoles entenderían sus palabras. Sólo entonces entenderían por qué tal acto era necesario para la salvación del mundo.

Incluso ahora, podemos luchar con la necesidad de la Semana Santa. ¿Con qué frecuencia escuchamos quejas contra el silencio de Dios, como si Él fuera el “asalariado” que “huye” del sufrimiento? La vida, muerte y resurrección de Jesús es, de hecho, nuestra redención. Dios mismo soporta todo el peso de las consecuencias del pecado. El Misterio Pascual es también un signo que ocurre a la vista de la experiencia humana. Hemos visto a Jesús dar su vida. Lo hemos visto acompañar a otros. “Yo conozco a los míos y los míos me conocen a mí”. Lo hemos visto llegar a quienes están fuera del rebaño tradicional, “ovejas no de este redil”. Jesús es el Buen Pastor, no sólo en las Escrituras sino en nuestra vida diaria.

Si bien no podemos experimentar caminar físicamente junto a Él como lo hicieron los Apóstoles, la gracia de nuestra redención continúa a través de la Iglesia. Somos pastoreados por los sacramentos, por la formación en la fe y por buenos mentores. Al mismo tiempo, no somos sólo ovejas. Al imitar a Jesús, nosotros también estamos invitados a dar nuestra vida por los demás. Podemos ser las manos, los pies y el cayado del pastor de Cristo.

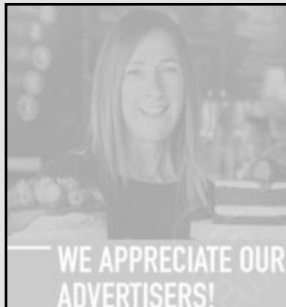

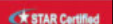

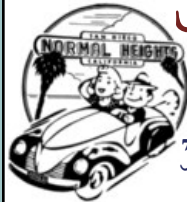
