I Am the Gate

Pride is an interesting sin in that we can't simply try harder to be humble. Even in the act of trying to be humble is an act of naval-gazing in which we end up thinking too much about ourselves. The virtue of humility is fostered in our ability to adopt the mindset of Jesus—to think, see, and act as he does. “Lord will only a few be saved?” He doesn't answer the question but reframes it saying, “Strive to enter through the narrow gate.” In other words, you're asking the wrong question. Don't spend your life evaluating and qualifying your own efforts, strategizing how you might earn admittance into the kingdom of God. Instead, focus on the ultimate end: God himself.

“Some are last who will be first, and some are first who will be last.” We also cannot waste time worrying about where we fall in the queue. The world may comment in any number of ways about our worth, our value, or our success. Don't worry about that. Focus on the ultimate end: Christ the Gate.

The reason Jesus invites us to strive to enter the narrow gate is that he knows we are actually capable of doing so. But our entrance does not rely on our own efforts; it relies on our ability to focus solely on Christ. The project of entering the narrow gate is an exercise in humility, moving us away from obsessing over what we should do or should not do and fixing our attention on what Jesus is doing within us. We need not concentrate on our actions so much as on the actions of Christ.

Humility, then, is not something we accomplish for ourselves. It is a gift for those who strive to enter the narrow gate. —*Living Liturgy*

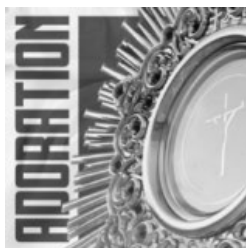

Yo Soy la Puerta

El orgullo es un pecado interesante, ya que no podemos simplemente esforzarnos más por ser humildes. Incluso intentar ser humildes es un acto de introspección, en el que terminamos pensando demasiado en nosotros mismos. La virtud de la humildad se fomenta en nuestra

capacidad de adoptar la mentalidad de Jesús: pensar, ver y actuar como él. "¿Señor, solo unos pocos se salvarán?" Él no responde a la pregunta, sino que la reformula diciendo: "Esfuércense por entrar por la puerta estrecha". En otras palabras, te estás haciendo la pregunta equivocada. No te pases la vida evaluando y calificando tus propios esfuerzos, ideando estrategias para ganarte la entrada al reino de Dios. En cambio, concéntrate en el fin último: Dios mismo.

"Los últimos serán los primeros, y otros serán los primeros que serán los últimos". Tampoco podemos perder el tiempo preocupándonos por dónde quedamos. El mundo puede comentar de muchas maneras sobre nuestro valor, nuestra valía o nuestro éxito. No te preocupes por eso. Enfócate en el fin último: Cristo, la Puerta.

La razón por la que Jesús nos invita a esforzarnos por entrar por la puerta estrecha es que sabe que realmente somos capaces de hacerlo. Pero nuestra entrada no depende de nuestros propios esfuerzos, sino de nuestra capacidad de centrarnos únicamente en Cristo. El proyecto de entrar por la puerta estrecha es un ejercicio de humildad, que nos aleja de la obsesión por lo que debemos o no debemos hacer y nos centra en lo que Jesús está haciendo en nosotros. No necesitamos concentrarnos tanto en nuestras acciones como en las acciones de Cristo.

La humildad, entonces, no es algo que logramos por nosotros mismos. Es un don para quienes se esfuerzan por entrar por la puerta estrecha. —*Liturgia Viva*

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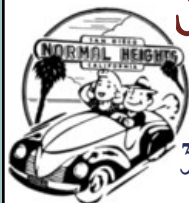
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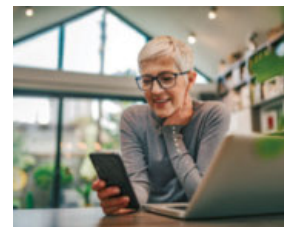
