By Your Perseverance You will Secure Your Lives

In today's first reading, the prophet Malachi says that the day is coming when *the proud and all evildoers* will be set on fire like stubble with *neither root nor branch* left behind. For those who fear the Lord, on the other hand, the *sun of justice* will rise with its *healing rays*. Although Malachi was writing before Jesus' birth, we know that the day of which he writes is the day when Christ has promised he will return as judge. This day will dawn like a blazing sun. The blaze will either burn us or heal us depending on whether we have done evil or feared God's name.

The theme of Christ's return continues in the second reading. In Paul's Second Letter to the Thessalonians, he addresses a specific problem faced by the community. It seems that there is a group of people that has stopped working because of their belief in Christ's imminent return. Paul tells them to mind their own business and instructs them *to work quietly and to eat their own food*.

By the time Luke's Gospel is written, "the proclamation of the imminent end of the age has itself become a false teaching" (Catholic Study Bible 1394). In today's reading, Jesus warns his disciples not to follow anyone who says, *The time has come*. Jesus predicts the destruction of the temple, an event which has already taken place when Luke's Gospel is written. He then tells them that before the temple falls, they can expect to be persecuted, to be handed over to the authorities even by their own friends and families. This, too, has already been fulfilled in the Acts of the Apostles, which Luke writes as a sort of sequel to his Gospel. Luke is showing his readers that Jesus is a prophet – one who speaks for God and knows the future.

Today's readings invite us to reflect on the end of the age, when Christ will return to judge the living and the dead, and of our own end, when we will meet him face to face. Jesus assures his disciples and all of us that we will face challenges, trials, and persecutions if we are steadfast in our faith.

But Jesus tells them that their perseverance in the face of persecution will secure their lives; this is true for us, too. If we persevere in faith and humility, then we can hope to experience the healing rays of God's justice when we meet Christ face to face. —*Faith Content*

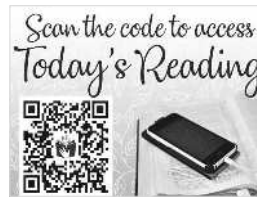

Con Su Perseverancia Salvarán Sus Vidas

En la primera lectura de hoy, el profeta Malaquías anuncia que llegará el día en que los soberbios y los malvados serán quemados como paja sin raíz ni rama. Para los que temen al Señor, en cambio, el sol de justicia brillará con su poder sanador. Aunque Malaquías escribió antes del nacimiento de Jesús, sabemos que el día del que habla es el día en que Cristo prometió su regreso como juez. Este día amanecerá como un sol radiante. El fuego nos quemará o nos sanará, dependiendo de si hemos obrado mal o temido el nombre de Dios.

El tema del regreso de Cristo continúa en la segunda lectura. En la Segunda Carta de Pablo a los Tesalonicenses, aborda un problema específico que enfrenta la comunidad. Parece que hay un grupo de personas que ha dejado de trabajar debido a su creencia en el inminente regreso de Cristo. Pablo les dice que se ocupen de sus propios asuntos y les instruye a trabajar en silencio y a comer su propio pan.

Para cuando se escribe el Evangelio de Lucas, «la proclamación del inminente fin de los tiempos se ha convertido en una falsa enseñanza» (Biblia de Estudio Católica 1394). En la lectura de hoy, Jesús advierte a sus discípulos que no sigan a nadie que diga: «Ha llegado el tiempo». Jesús predice la destrucción del templo, un acontecimiento que ya había ocurrido cuando se escribió el Evangelio de Lucas. Luego les dice que, antes de que el templo caiga, pueden esperar ser perseguidos y entregados a las autoridades, incluso por sus propios amigos y familiares. Esto también se cumplió en los Hechos de los Apóstoles, que Lucas escribe como una especie de continuación de su Evangelio. Lucas muestra a sus lectores que Jesús es un profeta: alguien que habla en nombre de Dios y conoce el futuro.

Las lecturas de hoy nos invitan a reflexionar sobre el fin de los tiempos, cuando Cristo regrese para juzgar a vivos y muertos, y sobre nuestro propio fin, cuando nos encontraremos con él cara a cara. Jesús asegura a sus discípulos y a todos nosotros que enfrentaremos desafíos, pruebas y persecuciones si somos firmes en nuestra fe. Pero Jesús les dice que su perseverancia frente a la persecución salvará sus vidas; esto también es cierto para nosotros.

Si perseveramos en la fe y la humildad, podemos esperar experimentar los rayos sanadores de la justicia de Dios cuando nos encontremos cara a cara con Cristo.

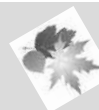

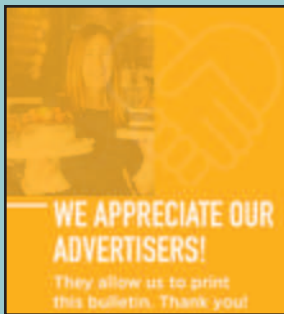
