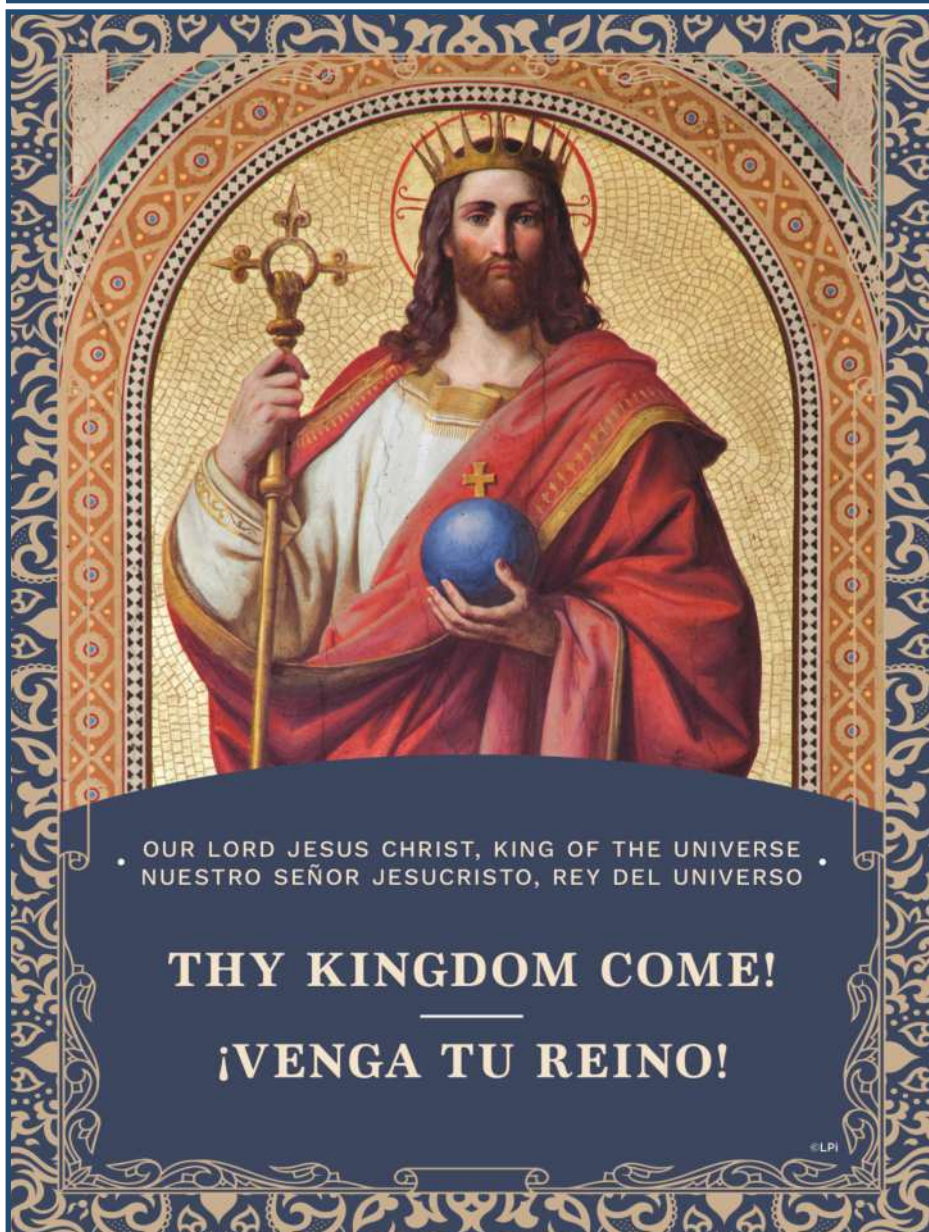

Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe

Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom.

Today the Gospel presents two responses to Jesus for our consideration. First, there are those who condemned and crucified him. Among them are the Sanhedrin (the assembly of Jewish leaders); there were also the Romans who conspired in the execution, the soldiers, and the jeering mob. They all had their reasons for rejecting Christ – but for them all, the result was the same: they hardened their hearts against him and cooperated in his death. Pontius Pilate placed an inscription above him which read, *Jesus the Nazorean, the King of the Jews* (Jn 19:19), but none of these conspirators were open to the fact that Jesus might, indeed, be a real king.

In contrast, the response of the so-called “good thief” to his encounter with Christ is a softening of heart. Hanging on his own cross, the good thief clearly understands his guilt and realizes that he is being justly punished for his crimes. His repentance humbles him and he is able to see who Jesus really is – a true king – and asks Jesus to remember him when he comes into his kingdom.

If we seek to emulate the good thief, we, too, need to have a clear picture of who we are – a picture which is conscious of our weaknesses and our need for God’s mercy. This requires humility. We must not give in to the temptation to reject Jesus’ kingship and to make ourselves the judges of right and wrong. But we likewise need to have great confidence in the goodness of our king. Saint Paul reminds us in today’s second reading that everything in heaven and on earth is reconciled in Christ; he holds all things in unity, making it possible for us to *share in the inheritance of the holy ones in light*. This is who our king is – he loves us and desires us to share in the inheritance of his kingdom.

For this reason, we can rejoice and have the same boundless confidence of the good thief, even in the face of our own sins and weaknesses. If our response to Christ is receptive, humble, and repentant, then we will not hesitate to seek his mercy and forgiveness so that we, too, might come to share his glory in paradise.

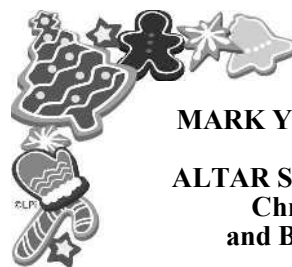

Jesús, Acuérdate de Mí Cuando Entres En Tu Reino

El Evangelio de hoy nos presenta dos reacciones ante Jesús para nuestra reflexión. En primer lugar, están quienes lo condenaron y crucificaron. Entre ellos se encontraban el Sanedrín (la asamblea de líderes judíos); también estaban los romanos que conspiraron en su ejecución, los soldados y la multitud que se burlaba. Todos tenían sus razones para rechazar a Cristo, pero para todos ellos, el resultado fue el mismo: endurecieron sus corazones contra él y colaboraron en su muerte. Poncio Pilato colocó una inscripción sobre su cabeza que decía: «*Jesús el Nazareno, Rey de los Judíos*» (Jn 19,19), pero ninguno de estos conspiradores estaba dispuesto a aceptar que Jesús pudiera ser, en efecto, un verdadero rey.

En contraste, la reacción del llamado «buen ladrón» ante su encuentro con Cristo es un ablandamiento de corazón. Colgado en su propia cruz, el buen ladrón comprende claramente su culpa y se da cuenta de que está siendo justamente castigado por sus crímenes. Su arrepentimiento lo humilla y le permite ver quién es Jesús en realidad: un verdadero rey. Le pide a Jesús que se acuerde de él cuando venga a su reino.

Si buscamos imitar al buen ladrón, también nosotros necesitamos tener una visión clara de quiénes somos: una visión consciente de nuestras debilidades y nuestra necesidad de la misericordia de Dios. Esto requiere humildad. No debemos ceder a la tentación de rechazar la realeza de Jesús y erigirnos en jueces del bien y del mal. Pero, igualmente, necesitamos tener una gran confianza en la bondad de nuestro rey. San Pablo nos recuerda en la segunda lectura de hoy que todo en el cielo y en la tierra está reconciliado en Cristo; él mantiene todas las cosas en unidad, haciéndonos posibles *partícipes de la herencia de los santos en la luz*. Este es nuestro rey: nos ama y desea que participemos de la herencia de su reino.

Por eso, podemos regocijarnos y tener la misma confianza ilimitada del buen ladrón, incluso ante nuestros propios pecados y debilidades. Si nuestra respuesta a Cristo es receptiva, humilde y arrepentida, no dudaremos en buscar su misericordia y perdón para que también nosotros podamos participar de su gloria en el paraíso.

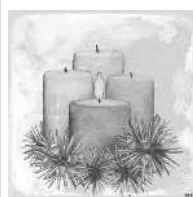

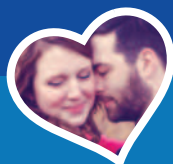
