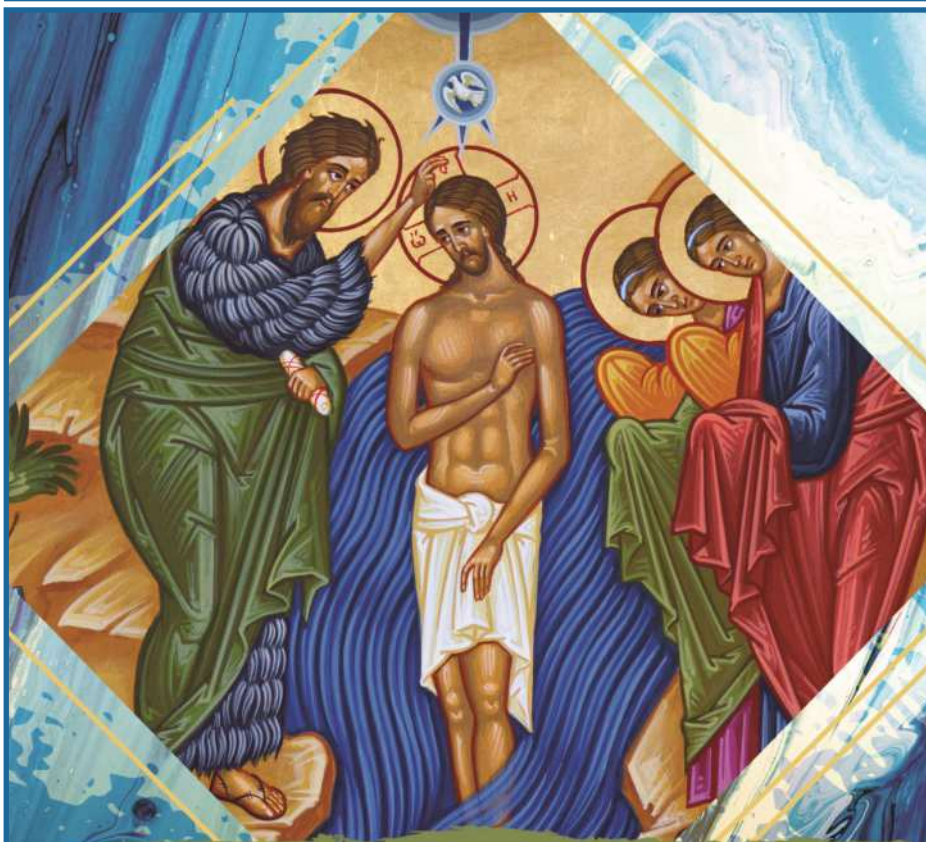

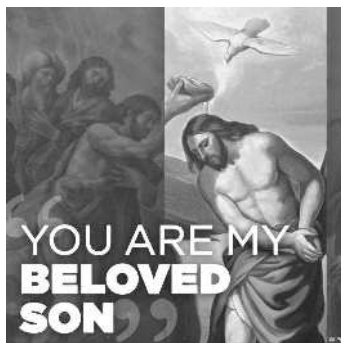

The Baptism of the Lord

After John initially objects to Jesus' request for baptism, Jesus says to John, *Allow it now, for thus it is fitting for us to fulfill all righteousness.* Jesus' words lead us to ponder what exactly is being fulfilled in

Christ whom we meet in the Scriptures and in our Mass today.

Our first reading says that Christ was called for *the victory of justice, to be a light for the nations, to open the eyes of the blind, to bring out prisoners from confinement, and from the dungeon, those who live in darkness.* These are promises not only for those who came before us in salvation history, but for each of the baptized.

Our Gospel invites us to consider how the Lord brings these promises to fulfillment in our lives. Where we fail to see as God sees, God comes to give us new vision. By the gift of his Spirit, he brings new insight and hope. When we are prisoners, stuck in sin and ways of living that hold us back from the fullness of life God desires for us, Christ gives us his mercy and the grace to walk again in freedom. When we find ourselves in darkness, God comes with his Spirit to bring comfort and light.

Jesus brought his healing to us through his baptism. We might wonder why Jesus was baptized, since it was a symbol of repentance and he was without sin. But our tradition tells us that as Jesus enters the river Jordan and the Spirit is poured out upon him; water itself is forever changed. Jesus, through his baptism, makes water capable of being the instrument of our baptism. What is more, Jesus unites himself to all who would ever be plunged in the waters of baptism. And so, in the waters of our baptism, Jesus' presence and power are made available to and poured out upon each of us.

Having received the gift of Jesus' life within us in baptism, we, too, are empowered. We have been given all we need to participate in Christ's work to bring light, life, and freedom to all whom we meet. As we approach this sacred table, let us bring all our needs to his loving power. In the Eucharist, Jesus, fulfills these promises to us. May our hearts be opened to receive his grace and blessing poured out on us today.

El Bautismo del Señor

Después de que Juan se opusiera inicialmente a la petición de Jesús de ser bautizado, Jesús le dice: «haz ahora lo que te digo, porque así cumplamos toda lo que dios quiere». Las palabras de Jesús nos invitan a reflexionar sobre qué se cumple exactamente en Cristo, a quien encontramos en las Escrituras y en la Misa de hoy.

La primera lectura dice que Cristo fue llamado para la victoria de la justicia, para ser luz de las naciones, para abrir los ojos de los ciegos, para sacar a los prisioneros del cautiverio y de la oscuridad de la cárcel. Estas son promesas no solo para quienes nos precedieron en la historia de la salvación, sino para cada uno de los bautizados.

Nuestro Evangelio nos invita a considerar cómo el Señor cumple estas promesas en nuestras vidas. Donde no vemos como Dios ve, Dios viene a darnos una nueva visión. Por el don de su Espíritu, nos da nueva comprensión y esperanza. Cuando somos prisioneros, atrapados por el pecado y por formas de vida que nos impiden alcanzar la plenitud de vida que Dios desea para nosotros, Cristo nos da su misericordia y la gracia para caminar de nuevo en libertad. Cuando nos encontramos en la oscuridad, Dios viene con su Espíritu para brindarnos consuelo y luz.

Jesús nos trajo su sanación a través de su bautismo. Podríamos preguntarnos por qué Jesús fue bautizado, ya que era un símbolo de arrepentimiento y él no tenía pecado. Pero nuestra tradición nos dice que, cuando Jesús entra en el río Jordán y el Espíritu se derrama sobre él, el agua misma se transforma para siempre. Jesús, a través de su bautismo, hace que el agua sea capaz de ser el instrumento de nuestro bautismo. Es más, Jesús se une a todos los que alguna vez serán sumergidos en las aguas del bautismo. Y así, en las aguas de nuestro bautismo, la presencia y el poder de Jesús están disponibles y se derraman sobre cada uno de nosotros.

Habiendo recibido el don de la vida de Jesús en nosotros a través del bautismo, nosotros también somos fortalecidos. Se nos ha dado todo lo que necesitamos para participar en la obra de Cristo de llevar luz, vida y libertad a todos los que encontramos. Al acercarnos a esta mesa sagrada, presentemos todas nuestras necesidades a su amoroso poder. En la Eucaristía, Jesús cumple estas promesas para nosotros. Que nuestros corazones se abran para recibir su gracia y bendición que se derraman sobre nosotros hoy.

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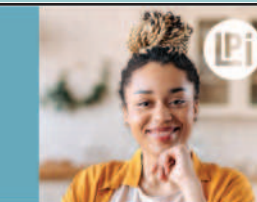

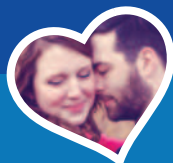
