Peace and Joy

Today's Gospel sets the scene for us: It was *the evening of that first day of the week*, that is, the evening of the Resurrection. Here, we find the disciples fearful in a locked room. And into this scene

Jesus comes, stands among them, and says, *Peace be with you*. As Jesus shows them his pierced hands and side, John says the disciples *rejoiced*.

The situation outside those walls had not changed; the disciples could still be arrested when they left the confines of that room. But the situation inside had certainly changed. Peace and joy prevailed within – not fear. And it was an encounter with the risen Lord that had changed things.

In our own lives, so many things can leave us feeling anxious or fearful – finances, career, family tension, health problems. At any time, but especially when we might be feeling anxious or filled with stress, an encounter with the risen Lord can bring us the same peace it brought to the disciples and stir a joyful response in our hearts. Even if the doors to our hearts are locked in some way (as were the doors in that room), the Lord can still come and bring us peace. Indeed, every time we gather to celebrate the Eucharist, the Lord comes in our midst and brings peace to our hearts.

But there are also deeply personal reasons we might experience turmoil and anxiety. When we act in ways contrary to God's law – when we sin – our conscience begins to trouble us and takes away our peace. We all have ways of trying to quiet our consciences, but none of them really work.

Thankfully, the Lord has given us the sacrament of reconciliation as a way to deal with our sin that brings lasting peace. In this beautiful sacrament, we are given an encounter with the Lord's infinite mercy. As we hear the words of absolution, we know that our sins have been truly forgiven. And the peace that floods our souls at that moment is a gift of the Lord that brings immense joy.

Peace and joy. Who among us doesn't want peace and joy in their heart? As we celebrate this Sunday of Divine Mercy, let us give thanks to the Lord for the gift of his redemption, especially through this sacrament he left us on the night of his resurrection. How blessed are we that the Lord, in his infinite mercy, continues to come to us and fill our hearts with the peace only he can give. That's something worth rejoicing about!

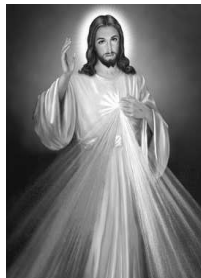

Divine Mercy Sunday Celebration

The Divine Mercy Group invites everyone to join us **after the 11:30am Mass this Sunday, April 12**, for a joyful celebration of **Divine Mercy Sunday**.

What is the story behind Divine Mercy Sunday?

In Poland during the early 1930's, Jesus appeared to a religious sister, St. Maria Faustina Kowalska. These private revelations had one key theme: the love and mercy of God. The relevance of this message was evident then and would continue to resound in importance throughout the social and political upheaval of the 20th century. One of Jesus' requests was the institution of a feast of God's mercy. St. Faustina records in her diary, "*I desire that the Feast of mercy be a refuge and shelter for souls ... let no soul fear to draw near to me ... It is my desire that it be solemnly celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter*" (Diary, no. 699). After St. Faustina's canonization in 2000, the Vatican declared that the Second Sunday of Easter would be known as Divine Mercy Sunday.

Diocese of San Diego

As previously announced by the Diocese in 2022, at the conclusion of a three-year visitation, the Apostolic See (*specifically the then-Congregation for the Institutes of Consecrated Life and Societies of Apostolic Life*) by means of a Decree dated 13 May 2022 and approved in forma specifica by Pope Francis, suppressed the religious institute formerly known as the Trinitarians of Mary. With this suppression, the former members of the Trinitarians were automatically dispensed from their vows and are no longer permitted to present themselves as religious. There is no right of appeal, and the Trinitarians have ceased to exist as a religious institute recognized by the Catholic Church.

The FINANCE COUNCIL will meet Thursday, April 23rd, at 6pm in the parish office. Council leaders are encouraged to attend.



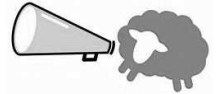

Paz y Alegría

El Evangelio de hoy nos sitúa esta escena: era la tarde de aquel primer día de la semana, es decir, la tarde de la Resurrección. Aquí encontramos a los discípulos, temerosos, en una habitación cerrada con llave. Y en medio de esta escena, Jesús entra, se pone de pie

entre ellos y les dice: «La paz esté con ustedes». Mientras Jesús les muestra sus manos y su costado traspasados, Juan relata que los discípulos se llenaron de alegría.

La situación fuera de esos muros no había cambiado; los discípulos aún corrían el riesgo de ser arrestados al salir de los confines de aquella habitación. Pero la situación en el interior ciertamente había cambiado. Dentro reinaban la paz y la alegría, no el miedo. Y fue un encuentro con el Señor resucitado lo que había transformado las cosas.

En nuestras propias vidas, son muchas las cosas que pueden dejarnos sintiéndonos ansiosos o temerosos: las finanzas, la carrera profesional, las tensiones familiares, los problemas de salud. En cualquier momento —pero especialmente cuando nos sentimos ansiosos o abrumados por el estrés—, un encuentro con el Señor resucitado puede traernos la misma paz que llevó a los discípulos y despertar una respuesta de alegría en nuestros corazones. Incluso si las puertas de nuestros corazones están cerradas de algún modo (tal como lo estaban las puertas de aquella habitación), el Señor puede entrar y traernos su paz. De hecho, cada vez que nos reunimos para celebrar la Eucaristía, el Señor se hace presente en medio de nosotros y trae la paz a nuestros corazones.

Pero también existen razones profundamente personales por las que podemos experimentar inquietud y ansiedad. Cuando actuamos de manera contraria a la ley de Dios —cuando pecamos—, nuestra conciencia comienza a inquietarnos y nos arrebató la paz. Todos tenemos nuestras propias formas de intentar acallar la conciencia, pero ninguna de ellas funciona realmente.

Afortunadamente, el Señor nos ha regalado el sacramento de la Reconciliación como un medio para afrontar nuestro pecado, un medio que nos brinda una paz duradera. En este hermoso sacramento, se nos concede un encuentro con la infinita misericordia del Señor. Al escuchar las palabras de la absolución, sabemos que nuestros pecados han sido verdaderamente perdonados. Y la paz que inunda nuestras almas en ese instante es un don del Señor que nos colma de inmensa alegría.

Paz y alegría. ¿Quién de nosotros no anhela tener paz y alegría en su corazón? Al celebrar este Domingo de la Divina Misericordia, demos gracias al Señor por el don de su redención, especialmente a través de este sacramento que nos dejó en la noche de su resurrección. ¡Cuán bendecidos somos de que el Señor, en su infinita misericordia, continúe viniendo a nosotros y llenando nuestros corazones con la paz que solo Él puede dar! ¡Eso es algo por lo que vale la pena regocijarse!

Tal como fue anunciado previamente por la Diócesis en 2022, al concluir una visita canónica de tres años, la Sede Apostólica (*especialmente la entonces Congregación para los Institutos de Vida Consagrada y las Sociedades de Vida Apostólica*), mediante un Decreto fechado el 13 de mayo de 2022 y aprobado en *forma específica* por el Papa Francisco, suprimió el instituto religioso anteriormente conocido como las Trinitarias de María. Con esta supresión, las antiguas miembros de las Trinitarias quedaron automáticamente dispensadas de sus votos y ya no están autorizadas a presentarse como religiosas. No existe derecho de apelación, y las Trinitarias han dejado de existir como instituto religioso reconocido por la Iglesia Católica.

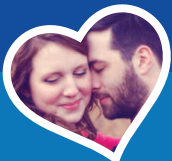
