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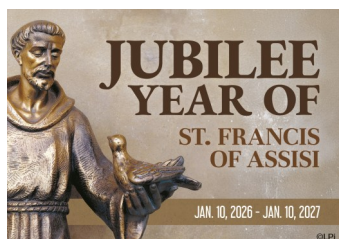
Centenary Jubilee News

“O woman, great is your faith!”

We are often quick to create divisions and distinctions that are not of God. And if we are honest, the “us” versus “them” mentality is present all around us. Even Jesus is guilty of

this for a moment in today’s gospel when he denies the Canaanite woman by saying, “I was sent only to the lost sheep of the house of Israel.” It’s makes logical sense. This woman was a Gentile, a non-Jew. Also, the fact that Jesus withdrew to the region of Tyre and Sidon suggests he was seeking some respite by entering non-Jewish territory. He was probably tired and ready for a break from all the attention, so much so that he ignores and even cruelly dismisses the woman. Jesus’s own biases and prejudices remind us of Jesus’s humanity.

But Jesus was deeply moved by this woman’s persistent faith. Not only was a non-Jewish person willing to challenge Jesus, but she was a woman who was willing to challenge Jesus. Just like Jesus’s interaction with the woman from Samaria, this would have defied all social norms and conventions. Jesus is coming to realize that his salvific mission is for all people, not just the Jews.

The broadened horizon is foreshadowed in the first reading from Isaiah. The Lord welcomes foreigners to the holy mountain because of their love and commitment to the covenant. Like Jesus in the gospel, perhaps we are invited to name and grapple with our own biases in the church. Who do we exclude? Who do we ignore because of their past actions? In the words of Isaiah, God’s house shall be called a house of prayer for all peoples.

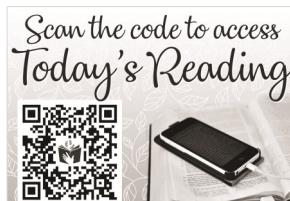

Diocese of San Diego-Trinitarian Suppression

As previously announced by the Diocese in 2022, at the conclusion of a three-year visitation, the Apostolic See (*specifically the then-Congregation for the Institutes of Consecrated Life and Societies of Apostolic Life*) by means of a Decree dated 13 May 2022 and approved in forma specific by Pope Francis, suppressed the religious institute formerly known as the Trinitarians of Mary. With this suppression, the former members of the Trinitarians were automatically dispensed from their vows and are no longer permitted to present themselves as religious. There is no right of appeal, and the Trinitarians have ceased to exist as a religious institute recognized by the Catholic Church.

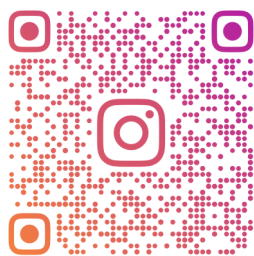

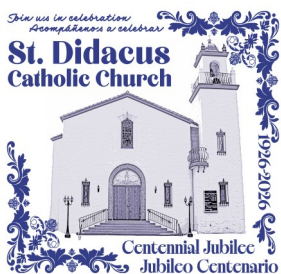

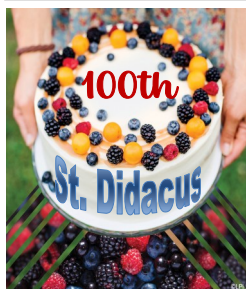

Diócesis de San Diego

Se les pide a los fieles de la Diócesis de San Diego que actúan con precaución ante un grupo de hombres que se hacen pasar fraudulentamente por sacerdotes y un obispo católico. Afirman ser Misioneros Guadalupanos del Santísimo Sacramento (MGSS) y están ofreciendo sacramentos a familias católicas a cambio de dinero. Si informa al público que cualquier sacramento conferido por estos hombres es inválido e ilícito. Este grupo de hombres—algunos de ellos sacerdotes ordenados, pero ahora reducidos al estado laical—han formado su propia secta; residen en Rosarito, pero no están en comunión con la fe de la iglesia católica romana. Se han recibido informes sobre la presencia de estos sacerdotes fraudulentos en nuestra diócesis; por ello, se les pide a los fieles contactar a su párroco en caso de tener conocimiento de cualquier incidente. Algunos nombres de sacerdotes fraudulentos son: Obispo Lauro, Octavio Aguilar Oliveros, Gabriel Figueroa y Raymundo Figueroa Pérez. Si alguna persona ha sido víctima de fraude en relación con estos sacerdotes, por favor, contacte a las autoridades.



“¡Mujer, qué grande es tu fe!”

Con frecuencia somos rápidos para crear divisiones y distinciones que no provienen de Dios. Y, si somos sinceros, la mentalidad de “nosotros contra ellos” está presente a nuestro

alrededor. Incluso Jesús parece caer en ello por un momento en el Evangelio de hoy cuando responde a la mujer cananea: “No he sido enviado sino a las ovejas perdidas de la casa de Israel”. Tiene cierta lógica. Esta mujer era gentil, es decir, no era judía. Además, el hecho de que Jesús se retirara a la región de Tiro y Sidón sugiere que buscaba un poco de descanso al entrar en territorio no judío. Probablemente estaba cansado y necesitaba un respiro de tanta atención, al punto de ignorar e incluso rechazar con dureza a la mujer. Los propios prejuicios y sesgos de Jesús nos recuerdan su humanidad.

Sin embargo, Jesús quedó profundamente conmovido por la fe perseverante de esta mujer. No solo una persona no judía estaba dispuesta a desafiar a Jesús, sino que además era una mujer quien lo hacía. Al igual que en la interacción de Jesús con la mujer samaritana, esto habría desafiado todas las normas y convenciones sociales de la época. Jesús comienza a manifestar que su misión salvadora es para todos los pueblos, no solamente para los judíos.

Esta visión ampliada ya se anuncia en la primera lectura del profeta Isaías. El Señor da la bienvenida a los extranjeros a su monte santo debido a su amor y fidelidad a la alianza. Al igual que Jesús en el Evangelio, quizá nosotros también estamos llamados a reconocer y enfrentar nuestros propios prejuicios dentro de la Iglesia. ¿A quién excluimos? ¿A quién ignoramos por sus acciones pasadas? En palabras de Isaías, la casa de Dios será llamada casa de oración para todos los pueblos.

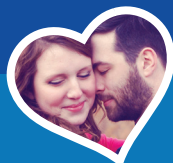
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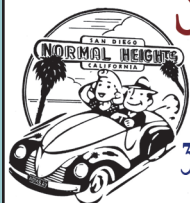
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
